ARRESTS MADE IN MARCH 2018

There were a total of 75 arrests made within the City of North College Hill in MARCH 2018.

40 of the arrests were recite arrests (the person arrested was not physically taken into custody but issued a citation and told to appear in court).

35 of the arrests were physical arrests (the person was physically taken into custody).

Of the total arrests made within the month of MARCH 2018, 21 were residents of North College Hill and 54 were non-residents.

IN MARCH 2018


There were a total of 39 auto accidents within the City of North College Hill in MARCH 2018.

TRAFFIC CITATIONS ISSUED

IN MARCH 2018

The North College Hill Mayor's Court had year-to-date receipts totaling \$48,049.014 as of MARCH 2018.



There were a total of **193** traffic citations issued within the City of North College Hill in MARCH 2018.

87 of the citations were for moving offenses (OVI, Speeding, Fail to Obey a Stop Sign, etc.)

28 of the citations were for non-moving offenses (Expired license plates, not wearing a seatbelt, etc.)

25 of the citations were for parking related offenses (Parked where prohibited by signs, etc.)

53 of the citations were written warnings (the person cited was not required to pay a fine or appear in court).



VEHICLES TOWED OR IMPOUNDED IN MARCH 2018

There were a total of 19 vehicles either towed or impounded within the City of North College Hill in MARCH 2018. (These vehicles were towed or impounded at the request of the police department)



FALSE ALARMS RECEIVED

The following narratives are a small sampling of the various calls for service the North College Hill Police Department routinely receives.


CALLS FOR SERVICE

Possession of Drugs (2925.11)

While on routine patrol, PO Wilber noticed a SUV with Indiana tags in a parking lot on Goodman Avenue. He watched a M/B in a red jacket and white pants standing at the passenger side of the SUV. The SUV was not parked in a space as if they were going to the business to conduct any type of legal transaction. The SUV was stopped by the front doors a business, and facing in a manner as if they were only stopping quickly and leaving quickly. The M/B left the passenger side of the SUV and then the SUV started out of

the parking lot. PO Wilber's experience in narcotics lead him to believe this was possibly a drug transactions as they are usually quick hand to hand transactions and the buyer will usually pull up and park in an abnormal position to be able to leave easily.


Once the SUV left the parking lot, PO Wilber got behind it at the intersection of Goodman at Hamilton. The SUV was in the right hand lane signaling to turn north onto Hamilton from the East side of Goodman. When the SUV turned north it failed to stay in its correct lane and actually drove in the middle of



both lanes northbound Hamilton for about 10-15 yards. The SUV then went westbound on W. Galbraith Rd.

Once the SUV got by our PD 1646 West Galbraith Rd., PO Wilber activated his overhead police lights. The SUV pulled into the parking lot of the Skyline Chili. Once on the lot, PO Wilber walked up to the driver and advised her one of the reasons he stopped her. The driver immediately stated that she did not have a valid license. PO Wilber then got the ID of the passenger. When he went back to his car, he ran both parties through RCIC. The driver did in fact have a Suspended license in the state of Ohio. The passenger had a misdemeanor warrant. At this point PO Wilber asked both females to get out of the car, and he put them in the back of a police cruiser.

PO Shepherd told PO Wilber that when the passenger was getting out it appeared that she dropped something into the middle of the center console area. PO Wilber told the driver that another officer saw the passenger possibly drop something in the center console area. PO Wilber asked Ms. Richmond if it was okay to search the car for whatever the passenger had dropped.



She gave consent. At this point the car was sniffed by our K9 officer and his K9.

After the K9 hit on the car, PO Wilber asked both subjects where the dope was. After some time during the investigation, the passenger stated to PO Wilber that the dope was inside the pants of the driver. PO Wilber then talked to the driver and eventually she stated she would just give us the dope.

The driver was transported to the CJC. The driver was searched by the female HAMCO CO Deputy, and 1.8 gross grams of what is believed to be Meth was found on her person. Ms. Richmond was charged with DUS and Possession of Drugs F-5.

Robbery (2911.02)

Officers were dispatched to the Penn Station for trouble with a customer. Upon arrival, PO Wilber met with the manager and another employee. The employee stated that 2 customers came into the store and ordered food. She stated that the heavy set female paid for her food, but got a water cup for the drink fountain. The suspect went over to the fountain drink machine and used the water

cup to try and get soda. The suspect was caught in the act and told to only get water since the water is free and the soda you have to pay for. The suspect then once again tried to get soda with her water cup. She was confronted again about the issue. This is when both suspects started to get irate. The suspects proceeded to grab cookies and another customers order from behind the counter. Both suspects then came behind the counter and began assaulting the employee. The manager went to intervene and the first suspect pushed him away. The suspects then fled from the store, and dropped the food they had stolen.

The employees got the license plate of the car that the suspects left in and stated it was a blue Saturn SUV. PO Wilber ran the tag on the car and when the first suspect's picture showed up, the employee stated that this person was the heavier set F/B suspect and the main aggressor of the situation.

Theft (2913.02)

PO Brown responded to an address on W. Galbraith Rd. for a report of a theft that occurred sometime between 02/27/18 at 0930

and 03/03/18 at 1000. The homeowners are in the process of cleaning the empty home as they have moved. They were last at the location on 02/27/18 and when they returned on 03/03/18, they observed that person(s) unknown had removed the outside AC condensing unit from the east side of the home. They also noticed that 3 window awnings and 1 door awning had been removed from the rear of the house.

The couple had hired a subject to remove garbage and rubbish from the rear yard, which was in fact completed. The owners stated that the job was completed; however, they have called him several times and have not received a call back from this subject. For that reason, the owners believe that this subject was the one who took the AC unit and the awnings, but are unable to prove that fact. The couple does have homeowner's insurance and will follow up with the company to see what their options may be. PO Brown will do further investigation in an attempt to locate the subject(s) that took this property without permission.



Criminal Trespassing **(2911.21)**

PO Henn was called to Norman Ave for a trespassing report. Upon arrival, he was met by the victim, who states she found a partially empty can of an alcoholic beverage in her rear yard. The can is upright, and was approximately 1/3 full of liquid. The victim's rear yard is completely fenced in, and the can is near the center of the yard. The victim states she has no idea how the can may have been placed there, and she has not seen anyone in her yard. The victim states her dog escaped from the yard sometime yesterday, and it is unknown if the subject(s) involved may have left the gate open.

The victim was advised a report would be on file with our department to document the incident as well as the procedure to follow for obtaining a copy of that report. She was further advised to contact our department should she observe anyone in her yard, and it was recommended that she install a light that will illuminate the rear yard.



Criminal Damaging **(2909.06)**

PO Six spoke to a complainant on station reference his vehicle being damaged by an unknown party. He states his vehicle was keyed while in Kroger, paying some bills. He stated he was inside for about 30 minutes or so. When he came out, a woman approached him and stated she had witnessed a female, black damage the complainant's vehicle. She gave a plate and described the vehicle as a "blue Honda." This tag was ran in RCIC and did not match the suspect vehicles description. After seeing the damage the complainant came to the station to make a report. The complainant also stated his vehicle actually belongs to his mother, who had passed away recently.

Assault (2903.13)

Lt. Petrocelli was dispatched to investigate for a pedestrian struck on the lot of Fricker's Bar. He was unable to respond immediately as he was on the scene of a Domestic Dispute. The Mount Healthy Police Department responded and conducted the initial investigation.

PO Baird MHPD responded to the scene. Upon arrival he found a chaotic scene with a female down in the parking lot. She was surrounded by several people from the bar who stated that she had been struck by a car which had fled the scene. The car was described as a Green Chrysler Concorde which was last seen traveling East on Goodman Ave then North on Hamilton Ave. PO Baird assisted the victim until the squad arrived. The victim was transported to Mercy West Hospital.

After interviewing several witnesses, PO Baird was able to determine the sequence of events which transpired prior to the vehicle fleeing the scene. According to witnesses, the Green car was parked in a parking stall at the West end of the parking lot facing the front of the business. Lt. Petrocelli was later able to determine who had parked the car in that location.

This person had driven the registered owner from Vince's bar in Mount Healthy as she believed that he was too intoxicated to drive, and had parked it there in the lot of Fricker's. Per the witnesses a physical altercation then transpired at the rear of this car, in the parking lot,




between the owner and an unknown male white subject. Then another subject joined the fight and all three were engaged in a physical altercation. The third subject states that he was attempting to break up the fight; until he was punched then he struck the vehicle owner. According to witnesses, the owner was knocked down and was being beat up by third subject and the other as yet unknown white male subject. Witnesses state that when the owner got up off the ground, he jumped in his car and started it up. He then accelerated rapidly in reverse. It was in doing so that the front end of his car swung around from him reversing rapidly that the victim was struck. She was knocked up into the air and landed on the ground. The victim sustained a concussion and abrasions to the left side of her body.

The witnesses state that after striking the victim, the vehicle owner put the car in drive and accelerated rapidly towards the third subject and the other unknown white male that had assaulted him. Both were walking towards Goodman Ave at the time. The owner sped towards them. This direction of travel was on a diagonal towards a row of parked cars and the double upright sign post supporting

the large Fricker's sign. There is no exit to Goodman Ave. in this direction and this runs diagonally across the lane of travel in the parking lot.

The witnesses state that had the subjects not jumped out the way they would have been struck by the car. They did jump out of the way and were not struck, the vehicle then slammed into a parked car and the sign uprights. Witnesses state that the two subjects then ran over to the driver's window and proceeded to strike the owner while he was behind the wheel. The owner then put the car in reverse, and accelerated rapidly in reverse narrowly missing the first victim who was quickly pulled away from where he was headed. The vehicle then reversed all the way out onto Goodman Ave did a three point turn and preceded East on Goodman Ave, and then North on Hamilton Ave.

Sgt. Nolte from MTHL was able to follow the trail of fluids left from the crash into the sign post. The trail led onto Goodman Ave, North on Hamilton Ave where it left the roadway and ran over a crosswalk sign, reentered the roadway, continued North On Hamilton Ave, to East on Galbraith Rd, to South on Bobolink Dr. The Vehicle was located in the lane of



travel, unoccupied in the lane of travel in front on Bobolink Dr.

The vehicle had heavy front end damage, a wallet containing the owner's ID was found in the street near the car. There was blood on the steering wheel; a swab was taken of the blood in the event DNA is required for identification purposes. A purse was found in the vehicle with ID from the initial driver. She states that she left it in the car when she drove it to the lot Fricker's. She states she was unaware of the events transpired after she parked the car.

This incident is still under investigation at this time charges may be pending.

Theft of Auto (2913.02)

Officers were dispatched to Bising Ave. for a vehicle theft that just occurred. Upon arrival PO Miller was greeted by the victim, who stated that an unknown male black wearing a black hoodie stole her vehicle. She stated that she started her vehicle to defrost her windows and then returned to her apartment for a few minutes. Upon leaving her apartment she saw the unknown male

black enter her vehicle drive off towards Hamilton Ave on Bising.

The victim stated that the vehicle is a push start and she is still in possession of the key fob. She indicated the vehicle was low on gas. A BOLO was broadcast and the vehicle was entered into RCIC.

Carrying Concealed Weapons (2913.012)

While working an off-duty detail, PO Kilgore was parked on the west side of Sundale Ave., facing east towards the bar on Savannah Ave. He was in a marked North College Hill Police cruiser. He observed a black Lexus 4 door pull up near the front entrance of the bar and park. The vehicle appeared to be occupied by one person in the driver seat. While the vehicle was parked, PO Kilgore could clearly hear the speakers from the stereo system from inside the vehicle. After a few minutes passed the subject did not turn down the music. PO Kilgore then placed his spot light on the vehicle to gain the attention of the driver in hopes he would turn down the music. The subject did turn down the music for a moment. However, a few minutes



later the subject turned the music up even louder than before. Due to the fact it is against city ordinance to have a car stereo so loud that it causes a disturbance I then approached the vehicle.

When PO Kilgore approached the vehicle he could still hear the music from outside the vehicle. He then knocked on the glass of the driver window. The subject in the driver seat then opened the door. As PO Kilgore advised him to turn the music down, he could smell a strong odor of marijuana lingering from inside of the vehicle. PO Kilgore then asked the subject if he had "weed" in the vehicle. He stated to me he just had smoked and handed me a small cigarette with marijuana in it. The end was still wet from him just smoking it. PO Kilgore also observed pieces of cigar wrappings and tobacco in his lap when the subject was sitting in the vehicle. He then asked the subject for his identification. The subject then handed me his wallet. He then stated his ID was inside the bar and asked to go get it. PO Kilgore then asked him if he knows his Social Security number. He then gave PO Kilgore his Social security card. While observing the subject he appeared to be very nervous. PO Kilgore asked him if it was only weed and if anything

else was in the car. He stated no. PO Kilgore then had the subject step out of the car and then detained him.

While placing the subject in the cruiser, he asked if he could use the restroom. PO Kilgore advised him he could when he was finished. He was very adamant about peeing in the street and PO Kilgore advised him not to do so. He stated to PO Kilgore he did not wish to be placed in the back of the cruiser and not to search his vehicle. He was advised since PO Kilgore recovered the small amount of marijuana and the odor still lingering in the vehicle he would search the vehicle. As PO Kilgore placed him in the back of the cruiser, he could feel the subject's heart rapidly beating and was becoming agitated. At this time PO Wilber had arrived on scene to assist PO Kilgore.

While searching the vehicle, PO Kilgore located a small zip lock baggie with pot leaves printed on one side, along with a few pieces of green raw marijuana in the cup holder of the center console. As he searched the driver side area of the vehicle, he noticed an orange colored rear sight of a gun along with a handle under the driver seat in reach of anyone sitting in that seat. PO Kilgore advised PO Wilber that he



located a handgun. PO Kilgore then took the weapon and cleared it. One round was ejected from the chamber of the gun. The magazine was also filled. The gun was identified as a silver and black HI-Point .380 caliber handgun.

After securing the weapon, PO Kilgore then Mirandized the suspect. He stated he understood his rights. However, He denied ever knowing anything about the gun in the vehicle. He stated the vehicle belonged to his child's mother and he has been driving it. The suspect was advised he was being charged due to the fact he is a convicted felon in possession of a firearm. He was transported back to NCPHD for booking and transported to CJC.

Domestic Violence (2919.25)

Officers were dispatched to Savannah Ave. for a male subject injured after being struck in the face with a brick. On arrival, they found the victim sitting in his vehicle. He had a laceration just below his nose that went down splitting his lip. He stated him and his wife were having a verbal argument when she struck him with a solid object. Officers were able to

make contact with the wife, who was found to have a laceration on her hand. She stated an argument occurred when they were at a bar. When they returned home she was on the stairs when her husband pushed her. That's when she grabbed the designer cap on the stair case and struck him in the face. Squad arrived and transported Mr. Newman to Mercy west.



Both subjects were intoxicated and the victim was informed once he is sober and released from the hospital he can come to the PD to fill out paperwork if he wishes to prosecute.

Possession of Drugs **(2925.11)**

On 3/28/18, PO Kilgore was called to Dollar General for a theft in progress. Before arriving on scene dispatched updated me that Loss Prevention had called back and stated the subject had left the building and was sitting outside in the parked lot in silver SUV, to the right of the entrance. They also stated the subject was a female white 5 feet tall accompanied with a male white.

When PO Kilgore arrived on scene, he located the vehicle occupied by the female white and the male white. As he pulled behind the vehicle, the female operating the vehicle suddenly put the car in reverse and attempted to pull off. PO Kilgore then turned on his overhead lights and advised over the radio he was out with the vehicle. When he approached the vehicle, the female stated to him that she did not take anything, before PO Kilgore could advice why he was there and why they were being stopped. PO Kilgore then asked the female to step out of the car. As she exited the vehicle, the vehicle then began to roll back due to still being in reverse. She was able to put the car in park. PO Kilgore then advised her she was being detained for an investigation of a theft offense. He then gathered information from the male half and he was found to have open warrants.

After both subjects were detained, PO Brown had arrived on scene to assist. When PO Kilgore went into the business to speak to Loss Prevention, the representative stated they did not physically see the subjects take anything but have stolen from the business in the past. The representative also said the subjects where grabbing things then ran out of

the store. They did purchase a few items from the store before going outside.

Both Subjects were found to have open warrants. The female was advised why officers were called and that they were suspected of taking items from the store. The vehicle the subjects were located in belonged to the female's mother. PO Kilgore did ask the female if there was anything in the vehicle that he should know about. She advised me that there was a small amount of marijuana in the center of the vehicle near the radio. After she admitted to having marijuana in the vehicle, PO Kilgore then asked her permission to search the vehicle. The female did give PO Kilgore verbal consent to search the vehicle



While searching the vehicle, PO Kilgore located a laptop bag under the driver seat. Inside the bag were a syringe and 2 digital scales. A small baggie of marijuana was located along with a half of a Xanax pill, hidden inside a green cigarette box. While searching the female's brown purse, PO Kilgore located a pink

wallet with a CVG Photo ID with the female's full name on it. Under that ID, PO Kilgore located a clear baggie that contained a white powder rock substance inside it. Another syringe was also located under the passenger seat.

The female was Mirandized and advised of what was found in her belongings, and in the vehicle. She stated someone had placed the baggie of white powder in her wallet and had no clue. She described the laptop bag and what was in it. PO Kilgore advised her that he located a syringe along with 2 digital scales in that bag. She also denied any of those items being hers. She did admit using meth.

The female was transported to NCHPD and charged for possession of Methamphetamine. While on Station, the female started to have a panic attack. She was checked by NCH Medics and was released. She was then transported to CJC. The male subject was re-cited on his open warrants and was released.

3 work orders were sent to Public Works. Rental registrations are out. We are now receiving them back and are putting all the landlord information into the database. We have 909 rental properties that we know of.
